The exhibition will also bring together a series of original paintings created by Azzopardi in 2005 for a montage of IKEA prints. These were the first Azzopardi paintings reproduced by IKEA and have never been shown in public before. It is the popularity of such published images that has contributed to Azzopardi's global success and resulted in her originals being sought-after by serious international

In 2009, Cynthia Corbett launched The Young Masters Art Prize, a not-for-profit initiative that gives a platform to both emerging and established artists who pay homage to the skill and innovation of the Old Masters and art of the past. The 2014 edition saw the launch of the first Young Masters Maylis Grand Ceramic Prize for artists working in ceramics. The fourth edition of Young Masters will be launched later this year, and judges include art historian Godfrey Barker and Secretary and Chief Executive of the Royal Academy of Arts, Charles Saumarez Smith. The winners will be announced in summer 2017.

About Deborah Azzopardi

Deborah Azzopardi is a London-based Pop Artist. She creates distinctive, colourful, cartoon-like scenes that reference her early career as an artist for Disney, an experience that she credits with developing her skill, craft and precision.

Thanks to the popularity of her published images in the global marketplace, Azzopardi's work is familiar to millions of people internationally, such recognition similar to that enjoyed by the Chinese Girl in the 50s and 60s by Vladimir Trechikoff. Published by Rosenstiel's her images appear in IKEA internationally and many diverse retailers in more than 50 countries throughout the world. Her originals are now sought-after by serious international collectors and sell for tens of thousands of pounds. Early works have been sold through Bonhams and Christie's.
