

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Lot.1 GRACE WEAVER

Estimated Retail Value: £8,000

Weaver's paintings and drawings tell stories of everyday situations and encounters. Examining her surroundings, generation and time, her paintings are 'allegories of the now', built from rich layers which reveal the influence of Philip Guston or Georg Baselitz, Fauvist colour theory and the warped anatomy of Mannerism.

Weaver has had solo exhibitions in New York, Glasgow, India, Erlangen, Oldenburger, Berlin and Reutlingen. Her work is in the collections of FRAC des Pays de la Loire, Carquefou, France; ARoS, Aarhus, Denmark; Columbus Museum of Art, Ohio.

Lives and works in Brooklyn, New York.

Estimated Retail Value: £55,000

Morris's multi-disciplinary practice draws on both personal experience and the history of art. Encompassing sculpture, tapestry, painting and drawing, Morris's intuitive use of line weaves between abstraction and representation. Morris's most recognizable body of work is her 'Stack' series, begun in 2014 and inspired by the artist's grief following a stillbirth.

The sculptures, which are comprised of irregular spheres precariously arranged into tall columns, evoke the swell of pregnancy. Morris uses the same deep pigments in her drawing and tapestry practice, which combines personal ciphers with abstract mark-making and grid-like structures.

Estimated Retail Value: £45,000

Drawing inspiration from the history of art and music as well as key philosophical and theological texts, Khan investigates memory, creativity and the layering of experience. His works in media include sculpture, painting and photography which rely on a continuous process of creation and erasure.

His work is in the permanent collections of Saatchi, British Museum, London; Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris; Tel Aviv Museum of Art; Musée National des Beaux Arts, Québec, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and the Solomon R. Guggenheim, New York.

Estimated Retail Value: £22,000

Arad is an influential British-Israeli artist, designer and architect. He was awarded the 2011 London Design Week Medal for design excellence and became a Royal Academician of the Royal Academy of Arts in 2013.

The artwork features renditions of the body of the iconic Fiat 500 automobile. Slow Outburst carries forward Arad's Pressed Flower series, part of the 2013 *In Reverse* exhibition at the Design Museum Holon, which utilises digital simulations to visualise cars being crushed.

Estimated Retail Value: £12,000

Azzopardi is known for distinctive pop art images which she has produced over the past 35 years. She breaks her subjects down into vibrant flat segments and adds glitter and strong colour.

Deborah Azzopardi portrays the Queen as a young woman, serene, happy, and glamorous. She is looking at the viewer with calm interest, wearing a light and feminine crown, embellished with platinum leaf, and a mink shawl. Deborah has sifted through magazines and royal portraits - her rendition of the Queen is a fictional depiction, an artist's take on her famous person.

Dame Phyllida Barlow DBE RA represented Great Britain at the Venice Biennale in 2017.

Known primarily for her colossal sculptural projects, she takes inspiration from her surroundings to create imposing installations that can be both menacing and playful. Her anti-monumental sculptures from inexpensive, low-grade materials such as cardboard, fabric, plywood, polystyrene, scrim and cement, are often painted in industrial or vibrant colours, the seams of their construction left at times visible, revealing the means of their making.

Estimated Retail Value: £20,000

Janet Sobel is one of the unsung heroines of 20th century art. Her idiosyncratic and shape-shifting aesthetic was championed by collector Peggy Guggenheim, artist Mark Rothko and curator William Rubin. Sobel's self-taught practice began in humble circumstances when she began to sketch memories of her Jewish upbringing in Eastern Europe. It also brought her to the attention of legendary gallerist and curator Sidney Janis, who included a painting by Sobel in his show American Primitive Paintings at the Arts Club of Chicago in 1943.

Sobel's works are in the collection of the Museum of Modern Art, New York.

Born in Ukraine in 1893, died in New Jersey in 1968.

Estimated Retail Value: £30,000

A multidisciplinary sculptor with a background in music, Beer creates sculptures, installations, videos, and immersive live performances that reveal the hidden properties of objects, bodies, and architectural sites. For his Resonance Project (2007), vocal performances stimulate the natural harmonics of built structures.

Beer has exhibited at Met Breuer, Metropolitan Museum of Art and MoMA PS1; Centre Pompidou, Opéra Garnier, Fondation Louis Vuitton, Palais de Tokyo and Chateau of Versailles, Paris; Istanbul and Venice Biennales. Beer is currently included in the British Art Show 9.

Lives and works in London and Paris.

Estimated Retail Value: £5,000 Starting Bid: £4,000 Aldridge works with a range of media; photography, textiles, ceramics and glass are all incorporated into a sculptural practice. Aldridge's sculptures invite an impulsive response that is interrupted by the barrier of not being able to physically engage with the work itself.

Aldridge has featured in several exhibitions including Kendall Koppe, Glasgow; Biennale of Contemporary Art Brno, Czech Republic; National Museum, Montenegro; National Gallery, Kosovo; and Kate McGarry, London. Her works are also held in a number of public and private collections including the British Council Collection.

Estimated Retail Value: £5,000 Starting Bid: £2,500 Azoulay's project, Queendom, was conceived for the Israel Pavilion at the 59th International Art Exhibition – La Biennale di Venezia 2022.

The point of departure for the current project is a nearly forgotten archive of photographed medieval metal vessels from the Islamic world, bequeathed to the L.A. Mayer Museum for Islamic Art in Jerusalem. These are precious objects that were produced in the Middle East, traded in the Levant, brought to Europe via Venice, and are now mostly held in Western museums. By scanning, cropping, and changing them onto new data carriers, Azoulay accentuates histories of appropriation and missing links in their geographies of knowledge. Azoulay lives and works in Berlin.

Estimated Retail Value: £8,000 Starting Bid: £4,000 Olivia Bax is an exciting new talent in the field of contemporary sculpture. Grounded in sculpture's histories and engaged in its futures, she spent her early twenties working as a studio assistant to Anthony Caro and after this, working on the sculptor, Charles Hewlings, archive. Bax was awarded the Kenneth Armitage Young Sculptor Prize in 2016 and was also presented with the Mark Tanner Sculpture Award in 2019.

Bax lives and works in London.

Estimated Retail Value: £1,000 Starting Bid: £500 Kara R Bieber began her career as a photographer, having her first exhibition at the age of 11. She has now moved into the medium of hand cut collage. Suspended between the boundaries of realism and fantasy, Kara's hand cut collages are an act of imagination and re-creation produced through the upcycling of magazines. Kara was awarded "Woman Photographer of the Year" at the Venice International Photographic Competition in 2005. Her amazingly vibrant collages have been featured internationally in galleries and private collections.

She examines how people see and define themselves through the relationships with their clothes and belongings. She has run her eponymous fashion brand for 15 years.

Solo Exhibitions include Kristin Hjellegjerde in Berlin and Palm Beach, Florida, The Armory Show NYC, and Anat Ebgi, LA in 2018. Site specific installation: ZAZ10TS Time Square, NYC (2018); Matter Out Of Place, 93 Baker St. London, Frieze (2018).

Estimated Retail Price: £11,000 Starting Bid: £5,000 Pierre Bonnefille is a painter, designer and Maitre d'Art, with a singular and poetic approach. He draws his inspiration from the colours of nature and uses architectural references from Venice, Pompei and Kyoto.

Pierre Bonnefille's signature 'Bronze Paintings' series are composed of powdered bronze, a material created by the artist. In this new explorative research, the bronze material is stretched out, liquefied and solidified in evanescent patterns on large abstract canvases. The bronze material finds itself suspended in a metallic mesh, revealing landscapes, aquatic reflections and silky traces which resonate with the light.

Estimated Retail Value: £11,000 Starting Bid: £5,000 Szabolcs' creatures are born out of the rich history of Hungarian animation, which has, from its beginnings in the 1910s, drawn on Hungarian folklore and mythology for its inspiration, with morality tales and the grotesque being the dominant aesthetic.

Szabolcs has had solo exhibitions at Sifang, Shanghai; Almine Rech, Brussels; Semiose Gallery, Paris. He also featured in group exhibitions at Almine Rech, Shanghai; Primary Projects, Miami ; ABC Gallery, Budapest ; ARCO, Madrid ; Ramp Gallery, London and L21 Gallery.

Estimated Retail Value: £2,000 Starting Bid: £1,000 Champion's artworks explore the relationships between ecology, industry, and the built environment. She expresses an interconnectivity between them which has become paramount to communicate in the face of climate change.

Her work featured in The Whitechapel Gallery, Modern Art Oxford, and the Zabludowicz Collection. She was awarded the Red Mansion Art Prize in 2010 and Arts Foundation Award for Sculpture 2013.

Champion lives and works in Thanet, UK.




Lot. 18 NICHOLAS CHEVELDAVE

Estimated Retail Value: £5,000 Starting Bid: £3,000 Nicholas Cheveldave's practice brings together a range of processes including photography, painting, and sculpture that culminate in densely layered collages and assemblages. His practice critically engages the ways in which Western consumer culture generates and defines the communication of contemporary identity.

Found images are harvested from accessible sources – including digital visual archives of commerce, like Craigslist, and social media, or cut-outs from daily commuter papers – are layered onto the artist's personal photographs.

Estimated Retail Value: £5,600 Starting Bid: £2,800 American feminist artist, art educator, and writer, known for her large collaborative art installation pieces about birth and creation which examine the role of women in history and culture, Chicago founded the first feminist art program at California State University Fresno and acted as a catalyst for feminist art and art education.

Chicago's most well known work The Dinner Party, permanently installed in the Center for Feminist Art at the Brooklyn Museum, celebrates the accomplishments of women throughout history and is widely regarded as the first epic feminist artwork. She was included in Time magazine's 100 Most Influential People of 2018.

Lives and works in Belen, New Mexico.

Estimated Retail Value: £6,500 Starting Bid: £3,500 The Israeli painter Yoram Chisin creates abstract works that explore the conflicting realities of war and beauty. Born in Toulouse, France, Yoram emigrated to Israel with his parents in 1973. His artistic practice fuses his love of beautiful textures and colours with emotions of pain, despair and bereavement. Using large, dripping squares of colour on a variety of supports including wood, jute, and raw linen canvas, Yoram aims to create works of arresting visual depth and sculptural surface.

Estimated Retail Value: £4,000 Starting Bid: £2,000 Cockett works in oil on linen, watercolour and gouache on paper. He completed his MA in 1996 at Dusseldorf Academy after his BA from The Slade School. In 1996 he had a solo exhibition at Galerie Weber, Munster, Germany, followed by 'Fraternise,' at Beaconsfield Gallery, Vauxhall. His vividly coloured paintings celebrate personal memories and dreams through deeply considered painterly gestures, referencing the legacy of twentieth century painting.

Estimated Retail Value: £4,000 Starting Bid: £2,000 Brand Deity No.1 (Mars - God of War) derives from Darbyshire's Brand Deities, originally commissioned by Selfridges in 2018.

Darbyshire says "I had a bit of a breakthrough whilst walking around the store when suddenly realising the similarity between the shopping emporium and museum layouts. I then thought back further and realised that if Greco-Roman temples informed the cathedral; the cathedral informed the museum; and the museum the mall ..."

His work was included in the Frieze Sculpture Park in Regents Park, 2022.

Estimated Retail Value: £2,000 Starting Bid: £1,000 Marijke De Roover is a performance and visual artist whose work examines a variety of ideas, such as dating, marriage, and heartbreak, exploring several key social hierarchies including gender, class, sexual orientation and institutional power.

De Roover's work is rarely about her personal life. She constantly adopts new guises throughout her work. In this way she highlights a tendency that has emerged through the rise of social media, with far-reaching implications on the behaviour and perception of the individual.



Estimated Retail Value: £6,500 Starting Bid: £3,500 Dermenzhi took her MA at the Academy of Music, Theatre, and Fine Arts in Chisinău, Moldova. She has had exhibitions in London, Moldova, and Beirut.

Her dynamic and frontal compositions are built up over time through colour-washes and painterly spills, intentional marks as well as organic expressions of paint. These large paintings show a masterful control of freedom, spontaneity, and considered mark-making. The works are simultaneously based around both real and imagined floral arrangements, always harkening to some sense of realism, but allowing for a sense of play, joy, and fantasy.

Estimated Retail Value: £2,000 Starting Bid: £1,000 Professor Nadav Drukker is simultaneously an artist and a scientist, based at King's College London, and makes stoneware and porcelain work which represents his scientific research.

Cut-21 has a deeply inscribed surface filled with blue porcelain to represent ink and paper. The mysterious cut carved into the side represents a mathematical model used in his work on String Theory.

He has exhibited in various private and public galleries including the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition.

Greenberg's practice focuses on landscape as a complex intersection between culture, geography and autobiography. Using a large format camera and film creates a multi-layered photographic perspective; pictorial and alluring yet seeking to disrupt

Hall creates video, painting, sculpture and multimedia installations that propose an uncanny hyper-reality, rife with tongue-in-cheek comedy and often teetering between flirty funhouse and technicolor nightmare.

Hall's 'Two Heads, Two Ways' uses the metaphor and physicality of a two-headed body, to explore how multiple personalities and possibilities of self are visualised. A dark onanistic fantasy of sex dolls and self-love unfolds by means of an out-of-body experience. Her body parts separate and multiply as her other self - her alter ego - becomes her lover. She received her MFA from CalArts in 2006. Hall's first gallery solo exhibition, The Other and Otherwise, was held at Maccarone, Los Angeles in 2019.

Estimated Retail Value: £9,000 Starting Bid: £4,500 Nicholas Hatfull is a painter of modern life primarily concerned with containers, textures, stains, fabrics and symbols. His paintings are synecdoches and trifles at the same time, a slideshow of impressions slowly fusing into a larger form.

Hatfull was the Sainsbury Scholar in Painting and Sculpture at the British School in Rome in 2011–2012, and has been the subject of three exhibitions at Josh Lilley, including the two-person exhibition "Through the Wall" with Victor Willing in 2015.

Estimated Retail Value: £5,800 Starting Bid: £4,500 Holmes is a self-taught artist whose work is characterised by gestural brushwork and distilled forms contrasted by vibrant neon lights. He creates diverse compositions, both intimate and tremendous in scale. The scope of his current work is wide, tackling notions of art, myth, introspection, and biography, while manoeuvring a wide range of iconography, visual vocabulary and mediums.

Holmes has exhibited widely throughout Canada, the United States and Europe including with Unit London. His work can be found in multiple important collections, including the Elton John Aids Foundation, Cleveland Cavaliers, Grant Gilbert, and United Talent Agency.

Lives and works in Toronto, Canada.

Estimated Retail Value: £4,000 Starting Bid: £2,000 Hughes is primarily a hand builder exploring form and decoration and establishing dialogues between the two. She works in both 2D and 3D with one often informing the other. She has a particular fascination with vases, resulting in collections which bridge the gap between the past and the present.

This piece takes inspiration from Ancient Greek pottery. The vases relate to distinctive ancient storage jars and the intricate decoration that was painted upon them, creating exciting patterns and shapes with a colourful, lively and painterly approach that gives them a new vibrant lease of life.

Estimated Retail Value: £5,000 Starting Bid: £2,500 Alison Jackson, a contemporary BAFTA and multi award winning artist who explores the cult of celebrity. Her work raises questions about how we cannot tell what is real or fake. She makes convincingly realistic work about celebrities using cleverly styled lookalikes.

Her work has been acquired by many public museum collections, including: The Parliamentary Art Collection, London, The National Portrait Gallery, London, SF MOMA, San Francisco, The Royal College of Art, London.

Estimated Retail Value: £8,000 Starting Bid: £4,000 Jodice explores the transforming social landscape of our time, with a particular focus on urban anthropological phenomena. His projects, many of which are created over several years, aim to build a common ground between art and geopolitics.

This work is part of the ongoing West series (2014 – present) which observes the last great Western empire and its history through photography, archival imagery and a collection of writings that contain the keys to understanding the sustained transitions.

Estimated Retail Value: £4,000 Starting Bid: £2,000 Rory Jones is a self-taught abstract painter. His popular works are influenced by abstract expressionists such as Kazuo Shiraga, Santiago Parra and Jackson Pollock. His artworks are held in various international private collections.

Jones' careful handling of the negative space is used through the practice of focussed silence. Using unconventional tools to apply the paint - mops, buckets, scraps of cardboard, wooden planks, pallet knives - the act of painting is physical and performative.

Estimated Retail Value: £3,500 Starting Bid: £2,000 Kaur creates sculptural objects and installations that explore the territory of cultural identity, home and belonging. She does this by innocent means, invoking childhood and domestic spaces, using simple forms, such as furniture and toys. These objects resemble displaced domestic belongings, which have been distorted and manipulated to invoke the uncanny.

Her work features in the collections of Arts Council, England; British Council, UK and in private collections in the UK and Spain.

"What interested me in particular in my early paintings of the 60s was to paint in a way that was on the edge of perception. The colour was less particularised in hue and more monochromatic. In the intervening years I gradually moved away from these ideas and began to use colour in a more active way. I choose ways of working that are simple and allow the interplay of formal and contingent elements."


