Decorated: The Sculptural Ceramics of Ebony Russell

Ebony Russell, the winner of the Brookfield Properties Craft Award 2025, presents a striking body of work that challenges conventional ceramic traditions.

Russell is an Australian artist renowned for her innovative sculptural ceramics. Using an unconventional method, she meticulously pipes porcelain in intricate layers, constructing gravity-defying forms. This technique subverts traditional decorative vessel-making, transforming ornamentation into structure and erasing the boundaries between the two. By embracing excess and indulgence, Russell interrogates the historical marginalisation of decorative arts, positioning decoration as a site of power and agency rather than frivolity.

Russell is the first international artist to receive The Brookfield Properties Craft Award. Represented by Cynthia Corbett Gallery, her radical reinterpretation of Wedgwood porcelain and its neoclassical traditions was a key factor in her selection.

The Brookfield Properties Craft Award 2025

Now in its sixth year, the Brookfield Properties Craft Award is the UK's leading contemporary craft prize, created in partnership with Crafts Council. Recognising expert craftsmanship and significant contributions to contemporary craft, the award honours artists who push the boundaries of material and tradition.

Russell was selected from a shortlist of exceptional artists, including wood artist **Alan Meredith** (Cavaliero Finn), glass artist **Chris Day** (Vessel Gallery), wood and paper artist **Isobel Napier** (Flow Gallery), and ceramic artist **Valéria Nascimento** (jaggedart). These artists' works are featured in the companion exhibition at **30 Fenchurch.**





Artistic Vision & Practice

Russell's work is deeply rooted in cultural memory and nostalgia, drawing from her Maltese-Dutch heritage. Her piped porcelain sculptures evoke sentimental, often kitsch domestic objects cherished by past generations – those kept in "good rooms" or locked away in display cabinets. Her technique – layering soft porcelain like cake icing – redefines labour and ornamentation, transforming traditionally feminine-coded decorative practices into structures of strength and resilience. The interplay between neoclassical restraint and exuberant embellishment is central to her work, offering a contemporary reimagining of Wedgwood's historic ceramic legacy.

Reflecting on her practice, Russell states:

"My work explores the marginalisation of decoration in Western art history, the historical association between women and ornamentation, and the evolving role of porcelain in contemporary art. This recognition not only celebrates my artistic journey but also underscores the significance of these narratives, emphasising the enduring relationship between women, craft, and decoration."

Ebony Russell, represented at Collect 2025 by Cynthia Corbett Gallery, is an Australian artist who approaches ceramic sculpture with an unorthodox methodology. Her distinctive technique emerged from an interest in gendered aesthetics, labor, and traditional craft practices. Russell meticulously pipes porcelain in intricate layers, creating gravity-defying forms. By challenging conventional methods of making decorative vessels, her work blurs the lines between decoration and structure, erasing traditional boundaries.

Russell's exploration of cultural and artistic practices, once regarded as feminine and thus insignificant, celebrates the decorative, the excess, and the playful politics of purity.
